## Q. Is there a charge to publish your chapter?

A. No. We do not charge authors to publish with us.

#### Q. Can I make my chapter Open Access (OA)?

**A.** Yes. We offer authors the option to publish their chapter as Open Access (OA) under a Creative Commons licence. For more information see our <u>OA guidelines</u> and applicable fees.

## Q. Can I include co-authors in the writing process?

**A.** Yes. We encourage the involvement of co-authors.

#### Q. How long do I have to write the chapter?

**A.** We would like to receive first draft submissions within 5 months of accepting the invitation but can be flexible about delivery dates to suit your other commitments.

## Q. How long should the chapter be?

**A.** We suggest a target length for chapters of between 5000 and 9000 words of text, excluding figures, tables and references.

#### Q. Will I receive a copy of the final publication?

**A.** Yes. Lead authors will receive a copy of the final published book in print or eBook format, as preferred, plus a copy of the chapter PDF they have contributed to. Co-authors will receive a PDF copy of the chapter they have contributed to.

## Q. Will the chapter be published independently of the book?

**A.** Yes. Our chapters are designed to stand on their own as pieces of content therefore will be available individually from our website and as part of our chapter database solution.

## Q. Will my chapter be indexed on Google Scholar and other platforms?

**A.** Yes. Together with our eBook partner Taylor & Francis, books and chapters are indexed on:
